2. Exhibits to be staged from 9.00 -11.00 a.m. on the day of the show, when the Hall will then be cleared for judging.
3. Every Exhibit must bear an exhibitor's card, which should be obtained from the Secretary on the morning of the show. Exhibitors to be responsible for the placing and checking of cards.
4. **Entrance fee 30p per entry. Children's Classes 20p.**

8. Anyone showing produce not grown in his or her garden shall forfeit all prizes which may have been awarded at the show.
9. Children can enter adult classes but the age of the exhibitor will not be displayed by exhibits. In the children's sections entries can only be in the appropriate age sections.
10. By arrangement with the Show Secretary it may be possible for non perishable entries to be left for exhibition prior to the 18th July.

50. A display of flowers/plant material to depict '**The Credit Crunch**'. Space allowed 36 inches (92 cms) wide, 48 inches (122.5 cms) high. Accessories may be used
51. An arrangement of **foliage**, no flowers, (Seeds, fruits and nuts allowed). 18 in (46 cms) max. No height restriction
52. **Modern** style arrangement using up to 5 flowers and any foliage, 18 in (46 cms) max. No height restriction
53. **Novices** class for floral art - *this is an award for anyone who has not yet won a prize in the Floral Art Section of this show.*
An arrangement of fresh flowers and foliage, not exceeding 18in (46 cms), overall

All Exhibits in this section to be **covered with cling film or a plastic bag**

Jars to be approximately 12oz (350gms) covered with cling film & sealed with an elastic band, with plain labels having typed or capital printed lettering

54. Chutney, one jar
55. Jam, one jar

58. Lemon Drizzle Cake



(4oz soft margarine, 4oz caster sugar, grated rind of 1 lemon, 2 eggs, 6oz self raising flour, 1-2 tablespoons of milk. For the topping, juice of 1 lemon, 2oz caster sugar)

Method: Cream margarine, sugar and rind together. Gradually beat in the eggs with the flour and milk as needed. Place mixture in a greased and lined 2lb loaf tin. Place in pre heated oven 150deg C/320 deg F, Gas mark 3 for 50-60 mins. Mix topping. Remove cake, leave in tin and pour over topping whilst cake is still hot. Leave in tin until completely cool)

59. Fruit Cake. (7 or 8 in. tin)
(6oz self raising flour, 1 level teaspoon mixed spice, 4oz butter or margarine, 4oz soft light brown sugar, 2 eggs, 6oz mixed dried fruit, 1oz chopped candied peel, 1oz chopped walnuts, milk as required)
60. Victoria Sandwich. (7 or 8 in. tin)
(6oz self raising flour, 6oz caster sugar, 6oz soft creaming margarine, 3 eggs, Jam filling, caster sugar for dredging)

61. Chocolate Brownies, 6
62. Fruit Muffins, 6
63. A quiche
64. Cheese Scones, 6
65. Decorated birthday cake for a 6 to 8 year old (*7 to 8 ins, cake will not be cut but judged on originality and standard of decoration*).
